



Title I School Improvement in Alief ISD

Introduction

Under the federal No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act of 2001, the Texas Education Agency is required to identify a Title I, Part A campus as being in need of improvement if the campus does not make Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) for the same indicator two years in a row. If the campus continues to fall short of the AYP standard, it moves to higher stages of intervention in the School Improvement Program (SIP). For the 2011-2012 school year, one Alief ISD campus, Taylor High School, has been identified as being in year 1 of the SIP.

School Choice

A district with a campus at any stage of intervention must offer all students enrolled at that campus the opportunity to transfer to a campus that has met AYP standards. For 2011-2012, Alief ISD has designated two high school campuses to receive AYP transfer students. Taylor High School students have the opportunity to transfer to either:

Elsik High School
Hastings High School
