

SUMMER SCHOOL GUIDELINES

ABSENCE POLICY

Alief summer school operates on the minimum time schedule required by the Texas Education Agency. Excused absences include personal illness and emergencies in the immediate family. Summer school students will NOT be excused for vacations or activities such as cheerleading camps, band programs, or other similar extra-curricular activities. **If a student acquires 2 absences in a semester course, he/she will be subject to loss of credit for that course with NO refund of tuition and will NOT be permitted to continue attending class.**

TARDY POLICY

Because of the short length of class sessions and academic intensity of summer school, prompt and consistent attendance is required. Under the Discipline Management System of the summer school site, students who are persistently tardy to class may be dropped from attendance of summer school. Five tardies of fewer than 10 minutes each shall count as one absence and being late 10 minutes or more shall count as one absence.

ASSIGNMENTS

Schedules are made by the administration based on enrollment. Courses cancelled due to insufficient enrollment will result in a refund or the opportunity for selection of other courses. No adds/drops will be made after the third day of classes, by 3:00 p.m.

DRESSING AND GROOMING/DISCIPLINE

All students attending summer school sessions in Alief I.S.D. schools will be subject to the dressing and grooming as well as disciplinary policies of the Alief Independent School District. Students will be subject to removal from the summer school program **without** a refund if referred to school administration more than twice.

TRANSPORTATION

Transportation will be provided for AISD students residing outside a 2-mile radius of summer school campus with limited times and stops.

Note: Students will receive credit for Combo Courses only when both parts A and B are completed.

COMBINATION COURSES – Combination courses are full year courses taught in sequence. These courses are NOT taught as separate semesters. The first half of the full-year course is taught in the FIRST two and one-half weeks, and the second half is taught in the LAST two and one-half weeks of the summer session.

IMPORTANT NOTE TO PARENTS

Please remember that Summer School Curriculum is presented at an extremely intense pace in order to cover the state required Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS) in a limited time period. **ALL** students enrolled in summer School courses will be expected to master at least 70% of the material presented.

GPA AND CLASS RANKING

Summer School courses will be considered for credit and used in determining grade point averages and class ranking.
